

Thinking Out Loud With Pastor Josh

Lent Midweek Prayer every Wednesday, 6:00 p.m. Holy Week April 17-19, 7:00 p.m.

Holy Week is a long, drawn out affair. It's not terribly enticing to consider coming to worship three nights in a row before coming one more time Easter morning. I'm saying this as the Pastor who helps organize and plan each of those services. I hope I'm not too far removed from reality to acknowledge it can seem like a lot.

It's why many Christian churches no longer have Holy Week, or condense it to one day. It's why Palm Sunday includes the passion of Christ. Church leaders wanted people to hear the story that is only told on Good Friday, knowing that it's not easy to get to Good Friday.

Trinity continues to hold onto holding worship all three nights. The three nights are a way for us to remember the fullness of Christ's betrayal, arrest, and death on the cross before we leap joyously into Easter morning. No, not because we insist on being morose. And not because we're trying to focus on the physicality of Christ's death in all its gory detail.

We are attempting to put ourselves into the patterns and thoughts that compelled, and allowed, Jesus to be tried as a criminal despite his innocence. We are struggling to comprehend the depths of Christ's love to allow any of this to happen, despite his divinity as God's Son. In early Luke, the devil is right. At any time Jesus could command angels to lift him from disaster and keep him from scratching his foot on a rock. At any moment, he could have done whatever was needed to put a stop to it, and continued on his way.

Holy Week defies our logic by interrupting schedules and expectations, pointing us to Christ's love for us. We can't believe we are loved so profoundly. We may not believe we are worthy of unconditional love. Yet, you are. You are forgiven, you are beloved, you belong to God. No matter what. Throughout Holy Week, this is the Word Christ proclaims into our lives. Across the three days before Easter, we slow our pace and hear God's Word speaking life into us, making us ready to dance and sing with joy on Easter.


Maundy Thursday
